President's Letter – Bud W3LL

ello, PVRC - September means the start of the PVRC election process.

I'll be retiring as PVRC president at the end of this year after having served for three years. It's the responsibility of the president to provide for a smooth outgoing transition. To that end the plan is as follows, predicated on election results:

I've chosen Tom K3AJ to assume the presidency. Tom accepted the offer.

Dan K2YWE accepted the offer to shift from VP to Treasurer. He'll be under the tutelage of Treasurer Tom for the next three months. Dan retains management of PVRC logo items.

VP Jay W3MMM will remain in place but with added responsibility for managing the Olympics Program and PVRC award plaque process under Tom's tutelage. Also, Jay will be managing Cheerleaders and a future triple award program. Additionally, Jay, as a contingency measure, will continue under the tutelage of Secretary Tim to understand and be able to execute core PVRC services. A full plate and great learning experience for Jay.

This frees up Tom K3AJ from treasurer, Olympic program awards and 5M plaque duties to be responsive to the many day to day issues that present themselves in addition to overall management of the leadership team.

Secretary Tim N3QE will continue in his secretary position, executing an overwhelming myriad of responsibilities. This will leave us with a new VP to remain flexible as a Special Projects Officer, as both Dan K2YWE and Jay W3MMM did when coming aboard. Although the by-laws allow for one VP, we are in the process of recruiting a VP, preferably from an outlying region of the PVRC circle.

Standby for the formal announcement of PVRC's two-month long nomination period beginning on 01 September.

I am nominating on 01 September:

The specifics of the 2019 election process will be the same as this year and in all previous annual election years.

1. Chapter chairmen will ask for nominations at both their September and October meetings.

2. Chairmen will forward nomination results via email to the PVRC secretary not later than 31 October.

3. PVRC Secretary Tim, N3QE will receive via email the September and October nominations from your chapter chairmen.

4. A list of all nominees received by Tim from all chapter chairmen will be sent to each chapter chairman via email on 01 November.

5. Chapter chairmen will hold elections at their November and December chapter meetings.

6. Chairmen will forward election results via the automated PVRC Meeting Attendance Report not later than 15 December.

7. Secretary Tim N3QE will post election results to the PVRC reflector not later than 31 December.

The PVRC by-laws Section 2 stipulate the following process: "The President shall call for the nomination of officers and the Board of Trustees in September. The floor shall remain open for additional nominations until October 31. The Officers and Trustees shall be elected by a majority vote of active, voting members. Election results will be announced by December 31."

Speaking of voting, the Roanoke Division Director race is an all PVRC event. Bud W2RU is chairman of our Roanoke-Blacksburg chapter and John Humphrey, W4IM is a member of PVRC Rappahannock chapter.

From the ARRL Letter:" In the Roanoke Division, the incumbent Director and Vice Director face challengers. Director James Boehner, N2ZZ, is being opposed for reelection by George Hippisley, W2RU, while incumbent Vice Director Bill Morine, N2COP, will be facing off against John Humphrey, W4IM, to retain his seat."

Please remember to vote: Ballots will be mailed from ARRL HQ to all voting members of the League in the Roanoke Division (WV, VA, NC, SC) shortly **before October 1st**. Those ballots must be returned to League HQ by the third Friday in November. I can't emphasize enough to please vote!!!

In case you haven't noticed, the Fowlfest date moved to 15 September from its typical end of August date. Unfortunately, that's also the date for the circle-wide PVRC PigFest at Steve's NR4M fabulous station.

Olympics Award 2018 Results – See Tom's K3AJ article elsewhere in this issue.

Another triple header award is in the making from the creative mind of Jay W3MMM. Standby for more on this exciting competitive award.

NAQP SSB - We just finished NAQP SSB. That's the last of a six-inning game for this year's NAQP Cup Challenge. We now await the results pending 'Preliminary Scores' being posted to the NCJ website. Will we get to keep the cup for another year? I don't know but I do know it's a close game.

Speaking of games here's a perfect segue into the game of contesting. So, let's get to the Sports Pages. Yes, <u>pages</u> with a plural since this also includes both July and the hiatus month of August.

Sports Pages 9/18

Although not a 5M contest, the IARU HF World Championship generates a lot of PVRC action. This year, with WRTC 2018 being conducted during the IARU (not to mention the PVRC competitors part of WRTC 2018), the PVRC turnout was especially big. In 2018, 62 PVRC'ers reported IARU scores on 3830scores.com vs. 44 in 2017. A lot of those playing reported having a lot of fun chasing down the "Y8" WRTC stations. The K0OO team at WA3EKL did their usual multiop thing as the only PVRC multiop in this one. In SOAB (A) CW HP N2YO (at NR4M) made the top 10 US with a score of 1.2M. This was Chip's first ever SO2R. N4ZR played in this category as well in his first "semiserious" effort from his new QTH coming in just under 500K. NA3M, W2CDO, W4MYA and KE4S all made north of 500 QSO in this category as well.

In SOAB (A) Mixed HP, N3QE (at N3HBX) appears to have the #3 US score with a score of 1.9M. K3AJ made just under 1,000 QSO for 532K in this category for the next highest PVRC score. W3LL looks to have taken the #1 US spot in SOAB (A) SSB HP with 1,461 QSO for 651K. In SOAB CW HP N4AF (operating as NY4A) has the #3 US reported score with 2,516 QSO and almost 1.9M. In that category, WJ9B and WA2BCK made over 1,000 QSO and N4CW, K2WK, WA4JUK and K0ZR all made over 500 QSO. K7SV appears to be #1 USA in SOAB CW LP with1,203 QSO for 726K. K4ORD is also in the top 10 US with 377/146K. LP specialist N8II is sitting in #2 US in SOAB Mixed LP with 875 QSO/483K.

The first 5M contest of the new season was the CQ WW VHF. It had to compete for time and attention with the NAQP RTTY. Conditions weren't great, but there were nice 6M openings on Sunday morning and a few EU QSO's were also workable Sunday afternoon on FT8. 2M wasn't real productive. Most of those who tried using FT8 reported that the frustration and confusion caused by the co-existence of two incompatible modes (standard and NA contest) in WSJT – let's hope this gets resolved soon.

Team W3SO has the #2 reported US score in Mutiop HP with 58K. Team WA3EKL devoted some time to this one while working NAQP RTTY with good results. W3RFC did a similar time sharing multiop effort. The top PVRC HP SOAB was by W3IP with 26K, closely followed by N3MK with 25K and then K3ZO (19K). Next scores in this category of note were by N3XF (8.9K) and WA3EKT (8.8K). N3ALN is in the top 10 reported scores in SOAB LP with 5.8K. N4MM broke 5K in SOSB/6 HP.

NAQP RTTY saw a good PVRC turnout, and those who showed up in the afternoon enjoyed some darn good e-skip yielding many QSO on 15 and 10. Storms in the evening made 80 a lot less productive than usual. The ionosphere giveth, and the ionosphere taketh away. PVRC'ers keep coming up with new and different ways to use the M/2 category in NAQP to maximize scores.

12 of the 27 M/2 scores reported on 3830scoires.com are from PVRC. Only one, N3DPB (at WA3EKL) really involved more than one operator (they made 489 QSO for 72K). Most are SO with assistance, putting them into M/2. W3LL was the top score using that method, with 583/100K. W4MYA and W4JAM broke 40K with that strategy. The redoubtable N3QE managed to do a one-person "real" M/2 with two signals on the air at a time by using the multiop capability at N3HBX. He sits with the #3 top recorded M/2 score right now with 897 QSO/172K. In the "classic" SOLP category, top PVRC scores were by K7SV (using SO2R for 105K), K4GMH (using SO2R for 97K) who fought off the

mental fog brought about by rushing back from the beach, K3AJ (65K), and W4GO (64K). We don't often see QRP entries in this contest but let the record show that K0OO operated W3RFC in that category, and N4NQY also gave it a shot with QRP.

NAQP CW is a PVRC favorite. A big turnout with decent conditions considering the season and the sunspot cycle. Although 15 and 10 were pretty dead, 20 and 40 were good and 80 and 160 were excellent. As K4FTO put it: "160 sounded like it does during 160 only tests." N4FX commented, "First time ever had more Q's on 160 than 80." Although it never helps to operate the low bands from a noisy city location, leading KE3X to offer a one words summary: "Yuck." Scores were hampered somewhat by the lack of high-band mults, but many reported making plenty of QSO. Perusing 3830scores.com just confirms an ever-growing trend in NAQP: single ops entering as M/2 to use spots. It looks like there were 22 PVRC entries like that. The NC4KW "real" M./2 at N1LN appears to be in the #1 spot with 1,679 QSO for 386K – despite computer woes (causing N4YDU to use paddle, paper and pencil for a while). W3UL put in a QRP remote M/2 from SOCAL. NG3K (at N3DPB) was another nice "real" M/2 for 788/119K. Scores north of 100K in SO M/2 were posted by N3QE, W3LL (ND3D), N3HEE and W2CDO. The top SO LP score in PVRC was by K7SV ("More Q's but fewer mults") with 190K. N8II was close behind at 188K. N9NB was next with 158K followed by KE3X (DC mult!) at 131K. Others posting scores north of 100K were K3AJ, N3UA and K3AU (K2YWE). And let the record show, with great sadness, that this appears to have been W4MYA's final contest score. Bob the Dude ran 'em for 8 hours for 451 QSO and 65K.

The NAQP SSB finished out the NAQP summer trifecta. It was truly painful with both space and atmospheric weather making this a most difficult contest. There was an epic PVRC turnout, but alas the QSO's and scores were down. Congrats to Team WX3B who is showing a slight lead on 3830scores.com over N5ZO for the #1 M/2 spot with 1324/205K. It just shows how truly awful conditions were if you compare the WX3B M/2 score with the NC4KW M/2 winning score in NAQP CW at 386K! NN3W (at N3HBX) was the ONLY PVRC SO (including SO M/2's) to break 100K. A great effort from Rich, still sitting at #1 on 3830scores with 1062/163K. W3LL M/2 but one radio (with W3LL and N4ZR) came close with 99K. N3QE, WB2ZAB, K4XL and KU1CW (@W4AAW) managed to make more than 500 QSO. WB2ZAB "owned" 20M early on with his high 4el antenna. Congrats to new member WA3MJZ for putting up his first ever contest score and KT3RR for his first from a new QTH. Ditto for AB3CV. It was tough duty even being a sure mult – as VP5/K4QPL can attest. This being the first contest following the passing of W4MYA, many PVRC and other ops across the country honored him by sending "Bob" or "Dude" as their name, and a warm shout out to our friends and competitors at SMC who fielded "W4MYA Memorial" Teams.

Oh, yes, between NAQP CW and NAQP SSB, there was another 5M contest. WAE CW in all its one-way QTC glory. Conditions were fair, all things considered. Teams NR4M and W3LL in M/S HP finished #2 and #3 respectively in the US. K0OO (@N3DPB) also put up a nice M/S HP score of 287K. PVRC'ers took 3 of the top 10 US spots in SOHP with KD4D (@N3HBX) scoring 1.3M at #1, KI1MI (N4CW) at #8 and N3QE at #10. K3RA didn't report to 3830, but he would have been well up in the top 10 US with his score of 608K. N1LN had a nice score in this category as well, with 401K. In SO LP K7SV is at #2 US with the top PVRC score of 347K, followed by W4AAW with 96K andW4EE with 60K.

For 2019, the overall program will be very similar. Of course, the objective is the same: "The goal of the PVRC Olympics is to encourage, broaden, and reward participation in PVRC contests and other club activities."

We received feedback and suggestions from several members and have acted on them in tweaking the rules for 2019. Those rules are now posted on the PVRC Web Site. The changes from 2018 are as follows:

- More flexibility is allowed in meeting the Sweepstakes requirement. Last year, it
 was necessary to submit scores in both CW and SSB to qualify. If someone had
 an unavoidable family commitment, a travel commitment, or other obstacle to
 being on for both modes they were eliminated. This year, the same number of
 total QSO's are required as last year for each level, but they may be earned in
 one or both legs of Sweepstakes. This is consistent with the way Sweepstakes
 club competition occurs, as clubs compete based on the total points achieved
 across both modes.
- In the "Other" category (in which the criteria is to accomplish one, two or three of a number of possible activities) two changes were made:
 - "Enter at least one VHF 5M contest" was added as an option.
 - Differentiation between levels of financial contributions to PVRC was eliminated. The language "Make a financial contribution to PVRC" is the same at each level.
 - The remaining options in this category remain the same
- The language governing awarding credit for participation in multi-op or guest-op situations has been modified. In general, the simple method of dividing total QSO's by the number of operators remains in effect, but a provision for requesting recognition for the contribution of an operator who made more than that average number of QSO's as attested by the station owner/host has been added. A change ensuring that station owners/hosts are not penalized for having multiple operators by crediting them with the full number of QSOs made in each operation was also made.
