ello, PVRC – This is transition season for PVRC as we move from summer to the

fall. A great time to be a member. It's also a transition period in our expanding awards program.

The PVRC Olympics Program ended for the 2017/2018 year in a spectacular fashion. Created by our Treasurer Tom K3AJ who wrote the rules, designed and procured the gorgeous Olympic medallion/coin and adjudicated the results. With the end of the Olympics season for this year, we transition to awarding those coins by our chapter chairmen.

I had the privilege to see those smiling faces at the NW meeting as Chairman Jim WX3B placed the black ribbon holding the coin over the heads of the silver, bronze and gold winners. The revised 2019 Olympic rules can be found thru our PVRC Website homepage.

We're also transitioning from the end of the 5M 2017/2018 season toward 5M award presentation time. Certificates for those on the ladder toward their 5M goal, plaques for those reaching the 5M plateau and endorsement plates are being awarded to hard working members by chapter chairmen. The NAQP Club Cup Challenge transitions to an end for this year with a well-deserved congratulation to SMC for retaining the trophy. But there is a positive outcome for PVRC in this competition. Everyone came out in force to achieve record breaking participation levels in this six-inning challenge. We congratulate all who gave points to PVRC.

With every challenge there is also a learning experience. Ours is the need to improve individual score contribution. Our Contest Champions did an outstanding job in raising the level of participation. Their next task, and yours, is to raise the level of our scores - especially in SSB and particularly in RTTY segments of these events.

The transition from summer to fall brings out the end of summer BBQ events, particularly Fowlfest and the Galactic Pig Fest at NR4M. Steve, host of the Galactic Pig Fest, thanked everyone for their help and participation – Steve's letter is <u>here</u>.

Transition also means my transition from PVRC president. I had the pleasure of awarding President Leadership awards to both Secretary Tim N3QE and to VP Jay W3MMM at the NW meeting. I'll be presenting two President Leadership awards at the Annapolis Kentmorr Crab Bash & Dinner. In addition, I'll also be attending the October Laurel meeting for a President's Leadership award presentation.

Transition also means the birth of an award. This month VP Jay W3MMM introduced the Inter PVRC Sweepstakes Awards. A new Triple Header program rolled out to increase participation at the Chapter level as well as offer a little in-house competition. Created by our VP Jay W3MMM, who wrote the rules and will design the trophies and adjudicate the results. Full details available <u>here</u>.

While we're on the topic of awards and trophies, VP Jay W3MMM took on the task of creating a spectacular PVRC Trophy Room commemorating all our past wins and losses in various contests throughout the history of PVRC. Secretary Tim updated the Prospective Member Map. Tim's creativity knows no bounds. The Google map has pins that display, when your cursor is placed over it, the Callsign of someone who submitted contest scores and is not a member of PVRC. A great recruiting tool for all of us to use. I discovered two nearby contesters that I intend to recruit. We can find this map from our PVRC website homepage.

VP Dan, who brought you PVRC Logo shirts and jackets, is now offering a group buy for the MORTTY V3 Kits at \$18 each. RTTY is default preload if none specified.

If you like the look of our homepage you can thank Bob K4NTO. I asked Bob a few months back to be a fly on the wall during our bi-weekly Officers Call to capture important items for inclusion on our PVRC website. As you can see Bob took the task to heart.

Speaking of awards, we recently received an award from NCCC for the 2017 California QSO party, Club Competition, Large Category, Non-California, Potomac Valley Radio Club. We'll be making this presentation soon to the deserving PVRC member.

Transition also means a change in a chairman position. I appointed Anthony WM3T to succeed Bud W2RU as chairman of the Roanoke – Blacksburg Chapter of PVRC. This relieves Bud to pursue his challenge to the ARRL Roanoke Division Director. We wish all the best to Bud in this important endeavor.

Transition also occurs during our annual election season. I had the pleasure at the September NW meeting to nominate: President - K3AJ Tom Valenti, Secretary - N3QE Tim Shoppa, Treasurer - K2YWE Dan Zeitlan and Vice President 1 - W3MMM Jay Horman along with a list of trustees to include all seventeen (17) presently serving. Remaining is an open nomination to fill one VP position.

Transition also means moving from the sometime doldrums of summer to the Fall big time WW contests. This month we have CQWW RTTY, and CQWW SSB. Let's get another two wins to hang in Jay's virtual Trophy Room.

Also, coming up is the week long W3ADO On Air Naval Academy callsign activation organized by Frank W3LPL. It will take place from Friday Sept 28 at 0700Z through Friday October 5th at 2359Z. W3ADO on the air operation will be during the international Enigma Reloaded event from PVRC member home stations -- not from the Naval Academy. Modes are CW, SSB and any digital.

"ENIGMA RELOADED" EVENT"

The "Enigma" was a German WWII code machine. The idea is to work these stations, each paired with an existing enigma cipher machine. See www.enigma-reloaded.it All the bands 160-10 are being used, including the WARC-79 bands, SSB, CW and digital modes. Spotting is allowed but the Activating Stations may not spot themselves. Others are encouraged to spot them.

The exchange is RS or RST. There is a scoring system, one point for a contact with one of the "Activating Stations" per day, per band, per mode. Some of the stations will not be on all modes. Multiply your total contacts by the number of different "Activating Stations" you work. European stations need at least 16 valid contacts for the award certificate. Others need just eight QSOs. Some "Activating Stations" will have multiple operators at multiple locations, in shifts. One example, K3CWO will have various members of the CWOps Club, CW only.

I've used up my word count for this month's column so now it's on to the Sports Pages written by Ghost Writer Tom K3AJ.

Sports Pages 10/18

It was tough slogging in the September VHF contest this year. No discernable E-skip on 6M in most of PVRC land, no real tropo to speak of and wet weather all conspired for low QSO counts and scores. Participation seemed to suffer as well. Nevertheless, three multiops with a number of PVRC ops and 16 SO entries were reported. Team W3SO scored a second-place finish in Limited Multiop HP with 435 QSO/72K. WA3EKL (@N3DPB) also played in that category with 95/3.1K. It was interesting that they made 28 QSO in 18 grids using an omnidirectional antenna and 100W on 2M. Team W3RFC also played as a multiop with 93/4.8K in MO HP. Among SO's, W3IP and N3HBX were almost tied for top PVRC score with about 29K each. K3AJ noted that well over half his QSO's in a very limited time effort were on FT8. K3ZO still sticks with SSB/CW exclusively and he made more QSO than K3AJ. K3CCR (N3UM op) slugged it out with some long dry spells between QSO, and only made 1 QSO each on 903 and 1296 owing to wet trees. W3EKT always hits the VHF contests hard and he scored 166/15.9K for a nice effort in SO LP and a top 10 finish. In SO 3Band LP W3LL (112/4.6K) andN3ALN (74/1.9K) both made the top 10.

WAE SSB didn't generate a big turnout with a couple of M/S entries and 11 SO's. But not much different than last year with 10 SO's. 40M and 20M were the money bands with few QSO on 15M and 10M and noisy conditions on 80M. KD4D (at N3HBX) made

the usual big effort in M/S (with an all-star PVRC team of K3RA, KD4D, KE3X, N3QE, N8II, N8IVN, NN3W) taking the top spot in the US with a score of 1.6M. Team WA3EKL (at N3DPB) made 452 QSO/197K also in M/S. By far the top PVRC SO score was by EA5DFV (no circle in WAE!) who had a top 10 world finish in SO HPO with 447K. NR3X (N4YDU), K4XL and K1IMI (N4CW) had top 10 US finishes in SO HP.

A decent turnout in the YO DX Contest found N2YO at NR4M putting up the #2 US score in SO Mixed HP with 552 QSO/381K. K1IMI (N4CW) scored a #2 in the US in SO CW HP with 334/141K. K3WI and K0OO also made some Q's in this one.

A dozen PVRC'ers played in the MD/DC QSO Party. N3QE put up the top PVRC score (and the top reported score overall as well) with 60K. N3UM and W3GB at K3CCR put up an impressive effort with 49K. W4GO/M was the top mobile entry with 36K. WR3R made 81 QSO for 7K in QRP. Other PVRC entries with 100 or more QSO were by K3AU (K2YWE), KS3O, K3MAW, KG4USN and W3FA.



Storm Damage at K4GMH – Mike K4GMH

On Sunday, 12 August 2018, a micro-burst with winds over 80 MPH plus rain hit my QTH outside of Fredericksburg (south Stafford County) Virginia, which caused considerable damage. Unfortunately, the QTH was at the center of the damage area including destroying the tower and all the antennas.



The tower, 130 ft Rohn 45, was doing okay in approximately the first half of the storm. No movement of the tower was seen looking at it through the kitchen window. Unfortunately, about then, a neighbor's tree was blown over on the tower's northwest set of guy wires. About that same time, another tree fell on top of the house, followed a few seconds later by the tower's mast coming to rest on the that tree. Now all I could see out the kitchen window was limbs and branches from the tree and a twisted antenna element. Although the mast sticking out of the tower came to rest on top of the tree on the house, the actual top of the tower had smashed into the whole house generator. Yes, you guessed it: commercial power then went out.



The whole house generator still started even after the tower smashed it. Unfortunately, it didn't provide any electricity. Had to go outside in the wind and rain to shut off the gas going to the generator to get it to stop. The good news is the commercial power came back on after being out for less than seven hours.

When the power came back the downstairs AC had stopped. A limb had penetrated the outside unit and stopped the cooling fan. Again, very fortunate the removing of the limb allowed the fan to start working and once more had AC.



The "Tower Top" picture shows a tree on the house roof, wiped out generator, the tower top, the remains of a 4-element SteppIR, a 40m Moxon and the bent 2-inch dia., 1/4 inch wall, chromoly steel galvanized mast. The tree saved much more damage to the house by absorbing the falling top of the tower rather than the house.

At the time of the tower being destroyed it was decked out with a pair of 40m Moxons, one at 140 ft and the other at 70 ft, a 4 element SteppIR at 130 ft and an 80m inverted vee with the apex at 120 ft and the ends at 80 ft. Only "pieces and parts" of the antennas remain.

Next tower will be a crank up as still too many trees that would have to be cleared to safely put up a guyed tower.

Here's hoping your Sunday was better than mine.

PAOWV Weak Signal Copying Pitch Test

Wim PA0WV has posted an interesting audio file where you can determine where your CW copying "sweet spot" is from both a pitch and a volume perspective. From Wim:

Interesting is to investigate how a minus 12 dB S/N ratio can be detected in noise with a bandwidth of 300 up to 2800 Hz. Lower pitch should have a better detection because the human mind has a built-in filter about one octave wide.

For that reason, I present a Morse wav file (**not** MP3 because these are compressed and mask weak signals.) The file is 8000 16-bit samples/s and 320 second duration. So may take some time for downloading 4.6 MB. It starts at 350 Hz and after each word space the pitch is increased 50 Hz.

The speed is 12 wpm, so that every ham has the opportunity to report decoded text and it is easier to decode slow code in noise. Remember when it is hard to decode: play with the loudness in order to find the best result.

Here's a picture of our new rotating tower two - known as T2 - with the stack of two five element yagis for 10M and a 40M yagi at 92 feet.




Two 40 Meter Broadcast Intruders Gone - Southgate Amateur Radio News

The IARU Region 1 Monitoring System (IARUMS) reports that two long-time broadcast intruders on 40 metres are gone. IARUMS Coordinator Wolf Hadel, DK2OM, said in the August IARUMS newsletter that Radio Hargeisa in the Republic of Somaliland on 7,120 MHz, and Radio Ethiopia on 7,140 MHz, departed the band during the last week of August. "We did not miss them," he commented.

IARUMS did report increasing military traffic on 7 and 14 MHz, "especially on digital modes from Russia and China." In addition, a wideband over-the-horizon (OTH) radar in China has caused serious problems on 20 meters, while an Iranian radar on 28,860 MHz "could be heard under sporadic E conditions." German telecommunications authorities have filed a formal complaint.

Hadel said a Russian Navy system believed to be in Moscow appeared on 7,182 MHz on F1A, a 200 Hz shift, identifying as RDL. German telecommunications authorities were notified. Reports of amateur band intruders can be submitted via the IARU Region 1 Monitoring System Logger <u>here</u>.

The \$200 Approach to Adding a Panadapter - via Tom N1MM



There are different opinions on how much value a panadapter display adds to a contesting station, especially when you look at return vs investment. I've been using a P3 with my K3, great for working split pileups but I don't think contesting return would have justified the cost.

Tom N1MM did a presentation to the Yankee Clipper Contest Club on a less expensive way to add those capabilities, his presentation is available <u>here</u>.
