President's Letter: Events Overtake US - Tom K3AJ

For the last couple of months, the Officers of PVRC have been discussing how we could supplement in-person Chapter meetings with on-the-air (OTA), web-based or conferencing service-based meetings. The reality is that the immense area of the PVRC circle makes it difficult or impossible for some of our members to get to Chapter meetings.

As the title suggests, "Events Have Overtaken Us." Maybe that's not a bad thing in this respect at least. Something like 50 PVRC members from across the circle participated in an OTA meeting called by NW Chapter Chair WX3B last week. Some other Chapters are already following suit with OTA meetings.

PVRC Treasurer Dan K2YWE has taken the lead on providing a web-based tool - GoToMeeting - for Chapters to use. Dan looked at a few possible services before settling on GoToMeeting and has established an account that any Chapter Chair can use. GoToMeeting simultaneously supports on-line audio/video participation or calling in to a phone number to be connected to a meeting. The necessary info has been provided to the Chapter Chairs.

At the present time, with group in-person gatherings prohibited, any OTA or on-line meeting called by a Chapter Chair will count as a PVRC Chapter meeting. Chapter Chairs will submit the usual meeting report. Attendance at these meetings will count toward Chapter meeting attendance for purposes of the PVRC Olympics. For now, we will not count OTA or on-line meeting attendance toward the two-meeting requirement to attain PVRC membership. We don't think that can or should be done without careful deliberation and consultation with the Trustees, since allowing that would have significant implications for PVRC.

We can't envision a future in which our members would want to forgo the fun and camaraderie of participating in in-person Chapter meetings. But for now, and probably in the future, we can be a better and stronger club by providing another option for members whose ability to get to an in-person Chapter meeting is limited.

## PVRC Northwest Chapter Old School Virtual Meeting – Jim WX3B





# Making Sure Your Contesting Opinions Are Heard – John K3TN



Periodically, hot topics arise about changing the rules of one or more contests, most recently when Frank W3LPL raised the issue of "for-profit" stations, like Remote Ham Radio, being used in contests, along with other related points. Like past issues (dealing with cheaters, should spotting count as assistance, what about remote operating, etc.) email threads on PVRC and other reflectors bloomed along with a big rise in traffic on CQ-CONTEST and other online forums.

I think it is important to note that posting an opinion on reflectors and forums doesn't necessarily lead to any change or impact at all. You need to make sure your opinions are **heard by the contest sponsors** – they are the ones who set the rules.

We are lucky in PVRC that we have several members who are on various contest sponsor committees, but we can't expect them to parse through every reflector or forum post. The best way to be heard is to contact sponsors directly - so, here are some pointers to how to contact them.

**ARRL Contests** – The ARRL Contest Advisory Committee members and their email addresses are listed <a href="https://example.com/here">here</a>. The CAC reports up to the Program and Services committee – you find their names <a href="https://example.com/here">here</a> but you'll have to look up their email addresses. You can find the email address of your ARRL Division Director <a href="https://example.com/here">here</a>.

**CQ CONTESTS** – The CQ WW contest committee has a contact form <u>here</u>. The CQ WPX contest director is listed <u>here</u>.

**NCJ Contests** – to reach the directors of the NA Sprints and NA QSO parties, look here.

**Other Contests** – the best place I've found to find contact info for state QSO parties and other national/DX contests is WA7BNM's <u>Contest Calendar</u>. Each contest listing has a link to the rules for that contest.

**World Wide Radio Operators Forum** – Sometimes issues are more related to overall contesting ethics, vs. individual contest rules. The WWROF focuses a lot in this area, you can contact them <u>here</u>.



After hearing about what some other PVRCers have done recently, and with increased shack time I gave it a shot. Just follow the directions <a href="here">here</a>, scroll down a bit to MorseRunner Mode. It is pretty painless.

One thing to remember: you will not hear anything in the headphones connected to your transceiver – you need to have phones connected to your PC soundcard. As Pete N4ZR noted, it does not indicate if you bust a call or exchange – I might go back to the standalone version just for that.



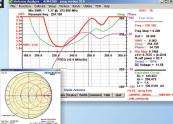
