or many of us, summer is the "off season" for contesting, a time to review past efforts and perform maintenance and upgrades on our stations.

Here at K8GU, I'm looking to put up some higher dipoles and eventually wire beams in the big trees on my lot to supplement the low G3TXQ hexagonal beam that barely scrapes ½-wavelength high on 20 meters. This becomes especially important as the high bands are open less and more marginally in the coming years. And, I need to get back on 160. Of course, every year, the goal is also to become fully active on VHF as well. I hope to at least be on 6/2/432 for the ARRL June VHF.


Those of you who have never been a member of another contest club may not realize this, but PVRC is a pretty great contest club. I've been a member of


K4VV Station Goes Silent






